Dangerous Prayer of a Desperate Soul

One reason we love the psalms is their honesty. In them we find ourselves. We find words that express our greatest joys, deepest passions, and worst fears. Psalm 143 is a psalm that reveals a desperate heart.

we do know is that in the moment of genuine desperation David turned to God. Oh, if only we could learn that lesson better.

WARNING: Psalm 143 is a dangerous prayer. Like anything danger-

ous, it needs a warning label. Below is the warning label for this psalm.



We do not know if these words came when David was being chased by Saul or Absalom. What

A desperate prayer will change the saint before it changes the situation.

Most of us are not real fond of being changed. That is a flaw we all tend to possess. It is also one reason why God puts us into desperate situations. He is not finished changing us.

You know you are in a desperate situation when v.4 fits you. You feel "overwhelmed" and "desolate". These words deserve your study, but basically they describe a soul that is weighed down, jarred, and frozen in place by the situation.

So, how did David pray in his desperation? Was his prayer left for us by God that we can learn to mimic it in our desperate times?

"No man has such need to pray as the man who does not care to pray. When you can pray and long to pray - why, then, you WILL pray! But when you cannot pray and do not wish to pray - why, then, you MUST pray, or evil will come of it! He is an the brink of ruin who forgets the Mercy Seat. When the heart is anothetic towards prayer, the whole man is sickening from a grievous disease. How can we be weary of prayer? It is essential to life! When a man grows weary of breathing, surely he is near dying! When a man grows weary of praying, surely we ought to gray anxiously for him: for he is in an evil case."

Dangerous Prayer of a Desperate Soul - continued

This psalm has two parts. There is a **CRISIS** noted (v.1-6) and there is some **CORRECTION** needed (v.7-12). The crisis reveals a *deserving* soul (1,2). One deserving judgment. It reveals a *desolate* soul (3,4). And, it reveals a *deliberate* soul (5,6). David pointedly studied God's past help and was stretching out his hand for help.

So, just how does one pray when in a desperate situation? How does one pray to God so that they put

themselves in a place of cooperating with the changes He wants to make? David's prayer contains seven pleas.

"Lord, I'm Losing" v.7a. His spirit was failing. He had nothing left with which to fight. Most of us must exhaust ourselves before we begin to seek God's help.

"Lord, Look at Me!" v.7b.

When God hides His face from anyone they are in trouble. To have God's face shine on us is His grace response to a humble heart.

"Lord, Love Me." v.8a. David wanted to hear God's lovingkindness. He did not want God to simply bend His neck in David's direction. He wanted God to bow His whole person and intimately minister to his situation.

"Lord, Lead Me" v.8b. When you are frozen in place by desperate times your first steps better be right. They had better be God's steps. David sought God's leading.

"Lord, Lift Me" v.9. The writer was asking God to pick him up, but why? David did not simply want deliverance from where he was. He wanted to be where God was. He wanted to flee to Him.

"Lord, Learn Me" v.10. The word 'teach' means to point in the right direction. It means to give a destination. David had great reasons to pray this way. He knew that God was his God, a good God, and that His ways

are right.

"Lord, Live Me" v.11. It is always the right time for us to pray that God would live through us. Yes, we need God's direction, but we also need His life and power. Only with this can we live our life for His name's sake, for His righteousness sake.

This is no quaint, polite prayer. As I said, if it is honestly prayed, it will alter your **WAY** – how

you will live. It will alter your **WHY** – why you are here at this moment in time. It will alter your **WHO** – who is living through you.

Have you and I learned yet that our troubles may be aimed at more than the health of our body or the state of our finances? They just may be aimed at crushing us spiritually to the point of fresh brokenness. They may be aimed at getting us to seek God's person and help rather than man's wisdom.

"Overwhelmed Soul"?

Both Ps. 142 & 143 refer to a person whose soul is overwhelmed. Just what does that mean? Digging into this phrase would make for a worthy word study. Discover where else this Hebrew word is used, who it was used of, and why they became overwhelmed.




